## Facilities

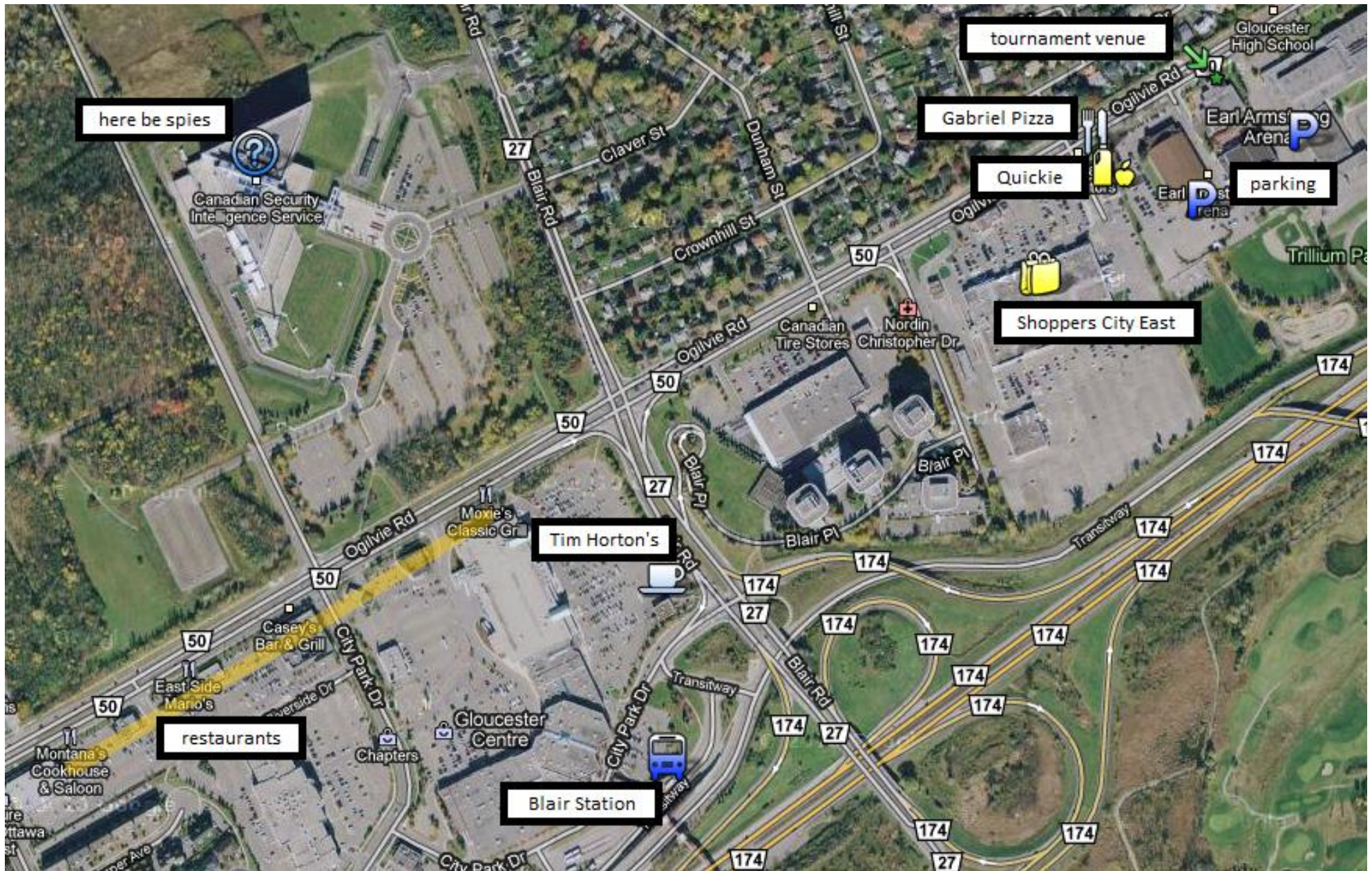
- Accessible washrooms are attached to both Room A and Room B.
